C. Statement of Case: Appeals Committee Chair asks for ICJIA's designated attorney to state for the record the relevant dates of: (i) receipt of appeal and (ii) any extensions of time agreed upon in order to establish compliance with 20 IL ADC 1510.100 et seq.;

D. Appellant's Case in Chief: Appeals Committee Chair asks appellant (or her counsel) to provide a summary of the evidence to be presented.

E. Illinois State Police: If there is a representative of the state or local agency present whose records are being challenged, then he/she will be asked to provide a summary of the evidence to be presented

F. Moving Records into Evidence: Once all evidence is presented, the Appeals Committee will formally acknowledge that the documents and records it received are moved into evidence.

G. Closing Statements (at the discretion of the Appeals Committee)

H. Appeals Committee Advisory on Rulings: The Appeals Committee has 28 days to make its findings of fact, its ruling and the arguments in support of that ruling.
