Executive Order No. 12 (2001)

- Established the IIJIS Governing Board.
- Governing Board was charged with:
 - 1. Identifying all justice information systems in Illinois and
 - 2. Developing a Strategic Plan for justice integration.

IIJIS Strategic Plan

- Introduced justice systems integration to Illinois stakeholders and practitioners
- Outlined strategic goals to address challenges confronting integration
- Included the Scenario for Information Sharing and the Gap Analysis
- Identified 7 Strategic Issues

IIJIS Strategic Plan (continued)

Seven Strategic Issues

- 1. Establish a governing body
- 2. Electronically collect and share justice information
- 3. Develop privacy guidelines that meet justice system needs
- 4. Coordinate integration resources
- 5. Establish data sharing and infrastructure standards
- 6. Develop a secure, reliable, and efficient IT infrastructure
- 7. Establish rapid identification through biometric technologies

IIJIS Strategic Plan (continued)

Scenario for Information Sharing in Illinois

• Identified the future functions and exchanges of information that should take place throughout the justice enterprise

Scenario Gap Analysis

• Existing justice information systems were validated against this scenario to identify the gaps which exist today.





Executive Order No. 16 (2003)


- Established the IIJIS Implementation Board
- The Implementation Board was charged with:
 - 1. Addressing the challenges identified in the IIJIS Strategic Plan and
 - 2. Setting goals and objectives for future justice information systems

IIJIS Implementation Board

Activities

- Coordinating the development & implementation of plans designed to make justice information readily accessible to practitioners
- Investigating standards that facilitate the electronic sharing of justice information
- Developing privacy policies related to the sharing of justice information

Technology Assistance Report





Included recommendations in four subject areas:

- 1. Governance structure
- 2. Detailed planning
- 3. Role definition
- 4. Project management

Governance Structure

- a) Increase the judiciary's role
- b) Enhance the executive steering committee's role
- c) Develop an operational committee that focuses on justice operations and business requirements

Board's Responses

- a) Coordinating with judiciary branch
- b) Executive steering committee empowered to make *operational* decisions
- c) Workgroups will address specific business case issues

Detailed Planning

- a) Conduct a Justice
 Information Exchange
 Model (JIEM) analysis of
 state-level data exchanges
- b) Identify operational needs develop solutions to meet those needs
- c) Create a detailed set of technical standards and business rules

Board's Response

- a) Began development of tactical plan to bring the initiative into the implementation phase
- b) Develop plans to meet the needs identified during the *Scenario Gap Analysis*

Role Definition

- a) Clearly define the state and local roles
- b) Focus on fostering those key state-level data exchanges that impact subject identification, status, and history information

Board's Responses

- a) Adopted the report's recommended role definitions
- b) Use the role definitions to frame business requirements that make up the tactical plan


Project Management

- a) Develop a program management office (PMO) to assist in the Tactical plan's development and implementation
- b) Coordinate and monitor the progress of statewide integration projects

Board's Responses

- a) The IIJIS initiative already had a PMO in the form of IIJIS staff
- b) Staff would perform PMO functions as outlined in the report






Tactical Planning

Strategic Business Issue

Work Group Membership

Current Situation
