## Read carefully to avoid omissions/errors or disqualification.

This program is 75% federal and 25% local cash match.

The formula is: take the total line cost and multiply by .75 for the federal amount. Divide the federal amount by 3 to get the match.

*Remember: You are required to obtain 3 individual quotes for the mobile data computers.* If there is a state bid contract for MDCs use of it will replace the need for 3 quotes.

No lease arrangements, warranty/maintenance coverage, start up fees or user fees will be allowed.

## Cover page

The Authority will complete the top section.

The second section pertains to the <u>IMPLEMENTING AGENCY</u>, which is the county/city/village administration.

The third section pertains to the <u>PROGRAM AGENCY</u>, which is the law enforcement agency. The bottom section tells us who to contact if we have questions after the grant is up and running. It is up to you whose names go here.

## Need Analysis

This page will give us all the information we need to determine the need for federal funding. Answer all questions thoroughly in order to be reviewed fairly.

## **Exhibit A: Program Narrative**

Much of the information is entered for you – feel free to add more if you wish. The summary requires you fill in some blanks. Even though some narrative is there for you, it is imperative that you read it and understand the contract you're about to enter into.

## **Budget Narrative**

Here again, we've entered the equipment items eligible for this program – you just need to complete the blanks for those items requested. **Round to the nearest dollar**. Sometimes the vendor includes everything in the cost of the MDC – then you only complete the line for the MDC.

## **Excel Budget Spreadsheet**

List each item from the budget narrative as a line item on the spreadsheet.

#### I Summary

To advance criminal history record improvement (CHRI) within Illinois, it is beneficial that each law enforcement vehicle be equipped with mobile data computers for access to criminal records while on patrol or during a stop. This will allow officers immediate discretion in handling persons encountered. Using incar mobile data computers improves criminal history records because the officer can use case and incident level data from criminal history data to link suspects and arrestees. The records will be automated, searchable and readily available to law enforcement during the arrest process. Additionally, the officer will be able to wirelessly enter incident information from the field including arrest information, improving timeliness and quality of arrest data in the criminal history records.

#### V Program Strategy

The mobile data computer grant program will fund the equipment necessary to have immediate accessibility to criminal history and related records while an officer is patrolling in the vehicle. Use of mobile data computers will improve the quality of criminal history records throughout the state of Illinois because the officer will be able to wirelessly enter incident information from the field including arrest information, improving timeliness and quality of arrest data in the criminal history records.
