Designation Adjustments

Dixon Police Department – Diversion / Deflection Program

The Budget Committee approved a reallocation of \$637 in FFY17 JAG funds to correct the final adjusted designation to the Dixon Police Department for its Diversion / Deflection Program, raising the final designation from \$103,236 to \$103,873.

The Budget Committee approved a set-aside of \$560,000 in SFY23 Illinois Family Violence Coordinating Council (IFVCC) funding for the SFY23 Notice of Funding Opportunities (NOFOs) for IFVCC Implementation Programs and Planning Programs. The expected period of performance for both the Implementation and Planning programs will be July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2023. Selected applicants to be presented to the ICJIA Budget Committee in late June.

8-D. Safe From the Start

New Notice of Funding Opportunity

The Budget Committee approved a set-aside of \$1,450,000 in Safe From the Start (SFS) funding for the SFY23 Notice of Funding Opportunities (NOFOs) for SFS Implementation Programs and Planning Programs. The expected period of performance for both the Implementation and Planning programs will be July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2023. Selected applicants to be presented to the ICJIA Budget Committee in late June.

9. Improving Criminal Justice Responses

Fund Reallocation

The Budget Committee approved a rescission of \$312,000 in FFY19 Improving Criminal Justice Responses (ICJR) funds that had been allocated to the CREST IL Pilot Program NOFO set-aside and made those funds available for future programming.
