



Featuring the National Resource Center on Domestic Violence and Firearms



In October of 2016, the Office on Violence Against Women awarded the Battered Women's Justice Project a TA award to develop the National Resource Center on Domestic Violence and Firearms, which includes the Safer Families, Safer Communities project and the launch of the first-ever website wholly dedicated to addressing the role of firearms and domestic violence.

The Resource Center includes a comprehensive library of information and tools on firearms and domestic violence and a community-based peer mentor system that connects communities which have successfully implemented firearm enforcement procedures with communities that seek to do so. Tools and assessment guides are available through the Resource Center to assist communities in identifying areas within their criminal and civil legal systems where implementation and enforcement can be enhanced. Through the Safer Families, Safer Communities project, communities will have the information, training and support necessary for developing and implementing effective enforcement mechanisms to disarm domestic violence offenders.

Title: First, Do No Harm: Trauma-Informed Interviewing During the COVID-19 Pandemic **Organization:** AEquitas: The Prosecutors' Resource on Violence Against Women **Project:** Prosecution Comprehensive **Date and Time:** Jul 21, 2020 3:00pm - 4:30pm EDT

Summary: This presentation will identify barriers to successful interviews and explore techniques for overcoming those barriers, with a special emphasis on virtual interviews that are compliant with COVID-19 social distancing measures. The presenters will discuss the limitations of a traditional fact-gathering approach and introduce alternative techniques to minimize re-traumatization and enhance our ability to re-create the reality of the crime at trial. An emphasis will be placed on strategies for integrating a trauma-informed response from the first contact with a victim through the conclusion of the case, with realistic goals for interviews and virtual meetings at every stage of the process. Objectives: At the conclusion of this presentation, participants will be better able to: Identify the signs and symptoms of trauma; Conduct interviews that minimize re-traumatization and yield evidence of the victim's experience of the crime; Implement trauma-informed strategies that enhance victim safety and participation; and Incorporate evidence of trauma during direct examination of the victim at trial.
