Notice of Funding Opportunity

The Budget Committee approved the use of appropriated SFY22 (amount yet to be determined) Community-Law Enforcement and Other First Responder Partnership for Deflection and Substance Use Disorder Treatment National Forensic Sciences Improvement Act (CLEP) funds to law enforcement agencies and other first responders to develop and implement collaborative deflection programs offering immediate pathways to substance use treatment and other services as an alternative to traditional case processing and involvement in the criminal justice system and unnecessary admission to emergency departments.
