**The Regional Institute for Community Policing (RICP)**, in cooperation with BowMac Educational Services Inc., is pleased to announce the offering of a unique **Critical Incident Management (CIM)** training program designed for Illinois local governmental administrative and executive level personnel. Municipal and county top-tier officials (municipal managers, department directors, chiefs, sheriffs) will be able to participate in an intensive and interactive three-day training, which offers “hands-on” simulation exercises to afford participants the opportunity to manage several types of critical incidents (WMD, CBRNE, natural disasters) using an “All Hazards Approach.” By applying the National Incident Management System (NIMS) structure, emphasizing CIM principles, and incorporating multi-disciplinary functions into a unified command post model, key decision-makers will be provided with a framework in which to evaluate their jurisdictional readiness for any major incident.

A “**team approach**” of 3-5 key executives from a community’s diverse public safety arenas (executive, fire, police, emergency response, public health, transportation, etc.), will enable CIM preparedness, planning and response to come alive under controlled, and “realistic” simulator exercises. Even if only one or two jurisdictional executives attend, they will gain immense knowledge and skills to plan, guide and manage local emergency preparedness response.

Participants will gain a working knowledge of local, state, and federal roles and responsibilities and will be able to demonstrate how to integrate the CIM principles into a unified command management response for all levels of incident significance. They will also have a clear understanding of executive-level incident response and recovery considerations; the application of resource management to support response and recovery efforts; and the incorporation of public health, transportation, media, and private sector/commerce infrastructures into response/recovery operations.

The core training component is certified by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Office of Domestic Preparedness/G&T—State Catalog Number: NM-001-RESP. The cost to attend this training is \$755 per participant, which covers all instruction and materials expenses, as well as daily refreshment breaks and working lunches.
