**PROGRAM Information**

<p><b>Detailed description of the program for which funding is requested:</b></p>	<p>The Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) for State Prisoners Program assists states and local governments to develop and implement substance abuse treatment programs in state and local correctional and detention facilities and to create and maintain community-based aftercare services for offenders. The goal of the RSAT Program is to break the cycle of drugs and violence by reducing the demand for, use, and trafficking of illegal drugs. RSAT enhances the capability of states and units of local and tribal government to provide residential substance abuse treatment for incarcerated inmates; prepares offenders for their reintegration into the communities from which they came by incorporating reentry planning activities into treatment programs; and assists offenders and their communities through the reentry process through the delivery of community-based treatment and other broad-based aftercare services.</p> <p>The state’s allocation is a base award of 0.4 percent of the total funds available for RSAT. Bureau of Justice Assistance will allocate a portion of the total remaining funds to each participating state in the same percentage that the state’s prison population represents relative to the total prison population of all states.</p> <p>10% of the state award must be set aside for a local correctional or detention facility.</p>

<p><b>If this is an existing federal program, what statewide programs are supported by this funding? How do these programs benefit Illinois residents?</b></p>	<p>Yes, this is an existing federal program. The majority of RSAT take place in both adult and juvenile correctional institutions except for the 10% set-aside which must go to a local jurisdiction. This program benefits Illinois residents by providing drug treatment to inmates that might not otherwise be available or be available on a smaller scale.</p>								
<p><b>Do any of these state programs target or benefit a specific district in Illinois?</b></p>	<p>The 10% set-aside for local correctional facility would benefit the district in which the facility is located. Recently this set-aside has gone to Franklin County for a juvenile methamphetamine treatment program.</p>
