


- In 2008, there were 97,580 adults serving a probation sentence in Illinois, a 4.7 percent decrease from 1999. The map shows the distribution of adult probation caseloads by county, in terms of the number of active probation cases in 2008 per 100,000 people.
- In 2008, 51.1 percent (49,983) of adults on probation were convicted of a felony offense, while 25.2 percent (24,603) were convicted of a misdemeanor offense.
- In Illinois, the number of adults serving a felony probation sentence remained stable (1.0 percent decrease) from 1999 to 2008. In contrast, the number of adults serving a misdemeanor probation sentence increased 15.1 percent during this time period.
- From 1999 through 2008, there was a 20.5 percent increase in the rate of active felony probation cases per 100,000 people in the Southern region, a 2.8 percent increase in the Northern region outside Cook County and a 14.7 percent increase in the Central region. In contrast, there was a 20.3 percent decrease in the rate of active felony probation cases in Cook County during that same time period.
- From 1999 through 2008, there was a 64.8 percent increase in the number of active DUI probation cases and a 58.1 percent increase in the number of active traffic probation cases, excluding parking violations.
