The NCJA to Host Regional Meeting on *The New Justice*, April 29, 30, 1999

On April 29, 30, 1999, the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice and the National Criminal Justice Association (NCJA) will host a meeting of state and local criminal justice practitioners to explore the principles underlying new justice strategies, such as restorative justice. The meeting will bring together practitioners from state and local criminal justice agencies from varying disciplines to introduce and reacquaint them with the NCJA and discuss issues of interest to criminal justice officials in the midwest region of the USA. Specifically, the NCJA Midwest Regional Meeting will address:

Justice for the New Century A leading scholar and experienced policy maker in state and federal government will discuss the image of a Anew justice[®] on providing offender accountability as well as repairing the harm done to communities and individuals by criminal behavior.

Building the New Justice Practitioners who have implemented new justice strategies will discuss what are the barriers and opportunities in this approach and what happens when a criminal justice system becomes Avictim-focused@.

What the New Justice Looks Like Mid Town Community Court in New York City is an example of a community which came together to address the quality of life in an urban neighborhood and created a new way of providing justice. Representatives from this pioneering program will discuss the opportunities, challenges, and benefits of a truly community-based court.

Planning for the New Justice A representative of the U.S. Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) will discuss the Comprehensive Communities Program and the Statewide Community Initiatives project which provide support to communities developing comprehensive strategic plans. An official from the New Jersey Attorney General=s office will describe a new initiative the state is undertaking to build capacity in 10 jurisdictions for community-based criminal justice strategic planning.

The View from Washington Participants in the Washington scene will provide their perspectives on Congressional and federal initiatives and priorities.
