

Identification of Research Priorities from Staff

Research and Analysis staff met to brainstorm and identify issues that should be the focus of our research agenda.

Staff drew from a number of sources when compiling their list of research priority issues. These include:

- Our current experience in working with criminal justice personnel and practitioners;
- Relevant research topics appearing in current journals;
- Information and media requests;
- Past planning materials; and
- Emerging problems facing the criminal justice system in Illinois.



Identification of Research Priorities from Staff

This comprehensive list of issues was then presented to staff and staff selected and ranked their top 5. These selections were then weighted and a final score applied. Some of the topics that ranked highest include:

- Issues related to methamphetamine;
- Mapping of criminal justice needs, services, and gaps;
- Collaborative efforts between criminal justice agencies, schools, and communities;
- · Regional issues, especially in rural areas; and
- Offenders with multiple service needs and the coordination of service.



R&A Management Review of Staff Identified Topics

- Assessed extent to which topics fit into our general "mandate" of drug and violent crime-related topics
- Assessed capacity to conduct research internally versus externally
- Assessed ability to contribute to body of existing knowledge given available resources

- Impact of punishment on medium to low risk probationers/offenders



DHS/DASA Research & Evaluation Priorities

- Substance abuse among juvenile offender populations
- Substance abuse, treatment utilization and outcomes of probationers
- Examination of the criminal history of treatment participants (pre- & post-treatment), and the treatment needs of the criminal population (DASA/ICJIA Data Linkage Project)



Illinois State Police Research & Evaluation Priorities

- Impact of law regarding limited sales of cold medications on methamphetamine production in Illinois
- Trends in drug submission to ISP crime labs
- Trends in Operation Valkyrie cases
- Trends in heroin use, availability and arrests
- Relationship between juvenile crime and subsequent adult involvement in violence



Illinois Attorney General's Office Research & Evaluation Priorities Out-of-state methamphetamine manufacturers using

- Out-of-state methamphetamine manufacturers using Illinois for chemicals & lab sites
- Impact of methamphetamine cases on child-welfare system
- Relationship between methamphetamine and domestic violence
- Cost to "society" of methamphetamine use and production

IDOC Research Priorities

- Evaluations of specific new IDOC programs and initiatives
- Research into sex offender recidivism
- Research on female offender needs
- Research to support strategic planning as identified by the Governor's Prisoner Reentry Commission
- Ongoing support of research and evaluation to support treatment within IDOC facilities such as the Sheridan Correctional Center



Criminal Justice Needs Assessment

- Conduct a replication of a needs assessment by ICJIA nearly 10 years ago
- Describe the issues facing CJS professionals regionally and statewide
- Determine research and evaluation activities

Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG)

 Federal funds that combine the Edward Byrne Memorial Fund and the Local Law Enforcement Block Grant into a single grant program



Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG)

- Law enforcement programs
- Prosecution and court programs
- Prevention and education programs
- Corrections and community corrections programs
- Drug treatment programs
- Planning, evaluation, and technology improvement programs



Victim of Crime Act (VOCA) Grant

- Federal funds supported by the Crime Victims Fund
- Distribution to states via a formula grant
- State grant administrator distributes to state and/or local programs via discretionary grants



Victim of Crime Act (VOCA) Grant

- Grants intended to improve and enhance the quality and availability of victim services
- Victim compensation
- Victim assistance
- Program evaluation and development
- Training of professionals providing victim services



S.T.O.P. Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) Grant

- Federal funds are distributed to states based on a formula grant program
- State grant administrator distributes the funds via state and/or local discretionary grants



S.T.O.P. Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) Grant

- Training
- Program development
- Protocol implementation
- Data collection and communication systems
- Victim services
- Multidisciplinary efforts
- Victim assistance

- Combined staff make up the Agency Planning Committee




JAG, VOCA, and VAWA In-House Planning

- Determine the picture of spending by fund, service area and region across the state
- Determine the level of need by service area and region across the state
- Present this information with recommendations for funding priorities to the Authority Budget Committee for approval
- Present the refined priority funding plan to the Authority Board for approval




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Research and Analysis Organizational Chart with Funding Source
