









Know your first and Last name, address, and phone number, plus area code.


Ask your mom or dad how to call 9-1-1, or your Local police, in an emergency.


If you are going to be home alone after school, call your momer dad when you get home. Let them know you got home safely.

Never go anywhere with a stranger. Say "NO," get away, and tell someone you trust.




If a stranger calls, or comes to the door, never tell them you are home alone.
