## Family group conferencing

Join us for an intensive training session on how to incorporate family group conferencing in your community. Guided by a trained facilitator, family group conferencing participants are given an opportunity to express their feelings about the young offender and the crime committed and work together to come to an agreement that describes what the offender must do to repair the harm. Also called community, accountability, and restorative group conferencing, family group conferencing includes members of both the victim's and the offender's support system, typically family members. Conferencing allows people to work together to resolve problems through cooperation, support, and empowerment. Research has shown high levels of satisfaction, with participants preferring a conference to a court appearance, as well as lower recidivism rates than traditional court processing.
