These programs are also referred to as victim offender conferencing and victim offender reconciliation programs. Although the term *mediation* may imply that the victim and offender are equals, this is not the case. The offender has the obligation to restore the victim. Victim offender mediation may be used to handle a variety of issues, from consumer complaints to domestic violence. Research has shown that both parties who participate in these programs have consistently been satisfied with the process.
