Internship tasks and opportunities

- Participate in Program Team meetings, interdepartmental project meetings, interagency meetings, agency meetings, and national technical assistance/monitoring meetings.
- Assist research staff from the ICJIA Center for Victim Studies with evaluation work for Illinois HEALS pilot sites including data gathering and site visits to pilot projects.
- Create project-related content for communications and publications.
- Assist with preparations for meetings and events with other professionals.

Qualifications

- Experience in direct social work practice through employment or previous internship.
- Strong oral and written communication skills.
- Enrollment in coursework and field placement seminar at the School of Social Service Administration (SSA) of the University of Chicago throughout the term of the field placement.
