
Geographic Distribution

Program Requirements

Be a:

- Local law enforcement agency
- County sheriff's department
- A multi-jurisdictional cooperative law enforcement





Program Requirements

- Have developed a plan to make potential clients and referral sources aware of the services available.
- Have a plan to coordinate program activities with community agencies in the service area, including:
 - substance abuse treatment,
 - medical care and supportive service providers, as well as
 - relevant government agencies.

- Project Management





Program Summary

- Provide a clear, concise summary of the program that you are proposing
- Include the problems or needs to be addressed and the outcomes to be gained





Statement of the Problem

- Description of Service Area
- Current Status
- Unmet Needs





Description of Service Area

- List the geographic area to be served
- Provide the population total
- The urban/suburban/rural characteristics of the area to be served
- Other descriptive information relevant to the statement of need





Current Status

Complete the data table using:

- ICJIA website
- ISP's <u>Crime in Illinois</u> report
- Other information may be available through local county health departments
- Explain the scope of drug and drug-related crime





Unmet Needs

- Describe unmet needs in the area to be served.
- Describe how the services and programs available in the service area meet current needs.
- Why the jurisdiction lacks adequate resources to implement the program without JAG funding.





Project Implementation

- Create reasonable steps for project development and operation of the program
- Include the agencies and potential grant funded staff positions responsible for each step.
- Use job titles: "police officer", "program coordinator", "social worker"
- Do not use names.





Goals, Objectives and Performance Indicators

- Agencies may propose implementing a Deflection program, or Diversion program, or both.
- Complete chart(s) for the program(s) proposed for funding by filling in the information marked with XX.
- Additional objectives may be added as deemed appropriate for the program. They must be measurable and within the scope and goal of the program





Project Management

- Describe how project success will be measured, how and when data will be collected and reported.
- Describe the plan for coordination and supervision of the project activities.
- Describe any potential barriers that you foresee and how they will be addressed.
- Discuss a plan to sustain the program when federal funding ends.





Budget

- Budget Detail
- Budget Narrative





Budget Detail

- Budget is complete
- Costs are allowable
- Costs are not supplanting
- Costs are reasonable
- Budgeted items are cost-effective in relation to the proposed activities





Budget Narrative

- Narrative is complete for all line items, clearly detailing how you arrived at & calculated the budget amounts
- Narrative describes why each line item is necessary for program implementation
- Narrative does not describe supplanting.
